FOR CANTERBURY



In working with Canterbury landscapers and developers we've noticed an almost exclusive preference in native street trees for Totara (Podocarpus totara), Kowhai (Sophora tetraptera), Manatu (Plagianthus regius), Hungere (Hoheria augustifolia), Ti Kouka (Cordyline australis), Horoeka, and Ferox (Pseudopanax spp, P crassifolium, P lessonii, P ferox). All of these make great street trees, no doubt about it, but they do also limit the variety of streetscapes over time. That seems a pity when so many other striking native species could be chosen from to add variety to streetscapes, and allow individual landscapers the opportunity to create statement environments.

Below are some excellent options for your consideration, all very suited to Canterbury conditions.



Chatham Is. Ake Ake (Olearia traversiorum)

An upright olive-like very hardy Olearia species with yellow flowers from Chathams Islands.



Kahikatea (Dacrycarpus dacrydoidus) Classic upright species with red berries which tolerates

dry but likes damp conditions.



An elegant, hardy tree with weeping foliage and profuse small white flowers.

Kanuka (Kunzea ericoides)

Tall upright and elegant classic NZ native and

surprisingly hardy once it has achieved 2m height. **Nikau** (Pitt Island selection)

An upright medium size tree popular in the North Island for its foliage, red berries, and full rounded form.

Titoki (Alectryon excelsus)
